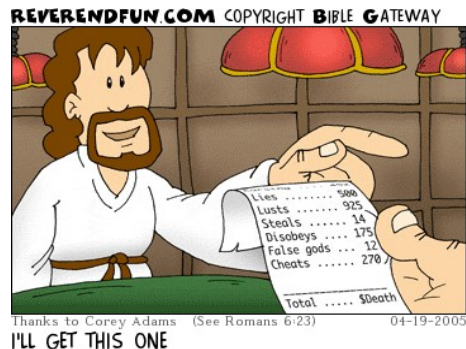

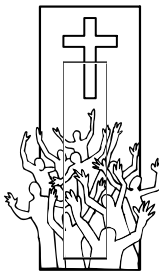

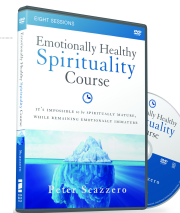

Emotionally Healthy Spirituality DVD Study
