A CALL TO PRAYER: THE PRIMATES' MEETING January 11-16 at Canterbury, England

The Archbishop of Canterbury has called a meeting of the Primates of the Anglican Communion to discuss the current division in the Communion, caused by the Anglican Church of Canada and the Episcopal Church U.S.A. The Primates of the Global South refused to come unless Archbishop Foley Beach, Primate of the Anglican Church in North America (our Primate) was invited.

Please pray for this very important meeting; for the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, for our Primate, Archbishop Foley Beach; and for our Diocesan Bishop, Charlie Masters, who will be accompanying him.

Pray that God's Holy Spirit will be present in power to convict where repentance is needed; to humble where humility is needed; to give discernment, where truth is obscured; and to give grace where forgiveness and charity are called for.

Pray that God's will would be done in and through the Anglican Communion.
