Questions for Further Reflection

5 STEPS IN NEHEMIAH'S PROCESS OF PRAYER

Step #1. _____.
"These are the memoirs of Nehemiah son of Hacaliah. In late autumn, in the month of Kislev, in the twentieth year of King Artaxerxes' reign, I was at the fortress of Susa. Hanani, one of my brothers, came to visit me with some other men who had just arrived from Judah. I asked them about the Jews who had returned there from captivity and about how things were going in Jerusalem." (Nehemiah 1:1-2)

"You survivors of the sword, go, do not linger! Remember the Lord in a distant land, and think on Jerusalem..." (Jeremiah 51:50)

"Things are not going well for those who returned to the province of Judah. They are in great trouble and disgrace. The wall of Jerusalem has been torn down, and the gates have been destroyed by fire." (Nehemiah 1:3)

Step #3. “Look down and see me praying night and day for your people Israel. I confess that we have sinned against you. Yes, even my own family and I have sinned! We have sinned terribly by not obeying the commands, decrees, and regulations that you gave us through your servant Moses.” (Nehemiah 1:6-7)

Step #4. “Please remember what you told your servant Moses: ‘If you are unfaithful to me, I will scatter you among the nations. But if you return to me and obey my commands and live by them, then even if you are exiled to the ends of the earth, I will bring you back to the place I have chosen for my name to be honoured.’” (Nehemiah 1:8-10)

“For thus says the Lord: ‘Only when Babylon's seventy years are completed will I visit you, and I will fulfill to you my promise and bring you back to this place...I will let you find me, says the Lord, and I will restore your fortunes and gather you from all the nations and all the places where I have driven you...I will bring you back to the place from which I sent you into exile.’” (Jeremiah 29:10)
